#### **Request for Council Action**

#### **Emergency Plumbing Repairs**

The news and energy of the month was plumbing. Korrect was here four times over two weeks. We knew this was gong to be a problem and it was. The final bill for the repair of three toilets and 1 sink was \$2,285. That fixed the leak down into the first-floor office.

Wilfred replaced the damage tiles in the main office.

# AED Installed and First Aid kit

The AED is in the case which is up on the wall in the hallway between the two buildings. There is a first-aid kit in the AED box as well.

#### SOMETHING NEW!!!

#### FREE LITTLE PANTRY AT ST. JOHN'S UCC!!!

What's a Free Little Pantry? A Free Little Pantry is a device that helps those experiencing food scarcity and who cannot wait to receive an appointment for a time at a food pantry/bank. The pantry allows folks to take what they need, when they need it. For this to work, however, it requires those of us who are living in abundance to help stock the pantry with items that others might need. We'll have a detailed list of items you can drop off in the near future, but for now, think of things like: feminine hygiene products, small diaper packs, canned food with pull-top lids, individual non-perishable snack packs, etc. Our pantry is open in conjunction with our friends at Good Neighbor House –who are helping to keep it stocked —but let's take ownership of this, St. John's and really work to help our community members who are in need! We can do this! Between the pantry and our fresh veggie beds, we can really help take a bite out of hunger!

It's not long now until we return to welcoming folks to worship with us in the sanctuary on Sunday morning! Wahoo! Some folks have asked: "So what will it be like when we return?" That's a really good question and it's one I've tried to both answer and allude to over the last few Tower Times issues. Making a long story short, things probably will sound a little different, feel a little different, and be a little different from what we've done historically. Truthfully, the world has changed, we have changed, and the church must change as

well! Some things you can expect when you return:

\*The tech station in the front of the sanctuary. This is big for us. We are currently reaching around 2,000 people per week –all over the world—with our online broadcasts. We would be highly foolish to stop these now! We try to keep things low-profile with our tech, but you may need to move your seat to get the view you'd like.

\*Speaking of seats, while the pandemic is subsiding, it's far from over. As such, we will continue to block off every other pew and ask folks to sit distantly in groups. We know this isn't fun, but it's the protocol we need to do for safety. We also will not be able to pass offering plates, pass the peace, or even take communion like previously did, but rest assured, we have some new and safe ways to accomplish all of these!

\*Also, for safety, we will still be requiring everyone to wear a mask until the CDC or the State of Ohio (preferably both) say otherwise. We also will be taking temperatures at the door with anyone having a temp over 99 degrees given a blessing and asked to watch from home until they are better. Finally, we will continue to have contactless soap dispensers in our restrooms on the main floor, sanitizer in the pew rows, and contactless sanitizers at the beverage station in the narthex and outside the sanctuary.

\*We will be keeping things confined to the main floor until further notice. This means we will not be holding fellowship hour downstairs at this time. We will, however, have some seating areas available—along with coffee, other beverages, and pre-packaged snacks—on the main floor and we encourage you to make use of the spaces before or after the service!

\*We have invested in A LOT of upgrades since the beginning of the pandemic! We encourage you to explore and get used to the new layout and feel of the main floor. All the items we have upgraded have been done with the intent of helping us better conduct ministry, particularly with those who visit. If you see something you don't understand or which rubs you the wrong way, come talk to myself, Rev. Jeff, or a council member; we'll be happy to explain the logic behind these things.
